

Bring any kind of hand work, stitching,

TOP 10 SECRETS TO GETTING YOUR QUILTY PATTERNS PUBLISHED



1. Be proud of your creativity. You are unique. Throw away the self doubt and negative talk that your work is not good enough.

2. Don't be a copycat. Review recent magazines and blogs so you can submit something unique.



3. Fabric and colors matter. Black is hard to photograph. Solids are easy to get. Stay current.

4. Do your best work. This design is a representation of you.



5. Follow the submission guidelines.

The publisher provides detailed info on what you should include.



Rules

6. Take great pictures of your work. Use natural light.



7. Expect to be paid, don't work for free. Prices range from \$50-150 for small items to \$300-400 for a large quilt.

8. Read the fine print. Work with a contract and make sure you know the terms. Copyrights can vary.



9. Don't take rejection personally. More often it is them, not you. They have enough pillows, had a similar quilt last month or want a different look. Submit it somewhere else.

10. Just submit it! You don't get published if you never send it in.

March's Block

Color scheme: orange, teal, brown, cream

Unfinished block size: 12.5"

Block instructions: Select four fabrics for the inside triangles. Cut 8" squares out of each of these 4 fabrics. Cut each square in half across the diagonal. You will have 8 triangles. Piece 4 of the triangles into a square. Cut 2" strips out of your border fabric and attach to each side of the pieced center. Trim to 12.5"



1. Select your fabric piece. Measure the dimensions of your piece
2. Purchase two sets of stretcher bars that are 3" shorter than each dimension of your fabric piece
3. Assemble the four stretcher bars. *I use a rubber mallet if the corners are not cooperating. If you have a square, adjust and straighten each corner of your frame.*
4. Lay the fabric piece face down. Place the frame on top of the fabric piece (the front of the frame will have a bevel edge, which should be placed face down).
5. Center the frame on the fabric. Pull the fabric around to the back .
6. Start with one staple in each side of the frame. Always work opposing sides after each other. Pull taut and staple as you work your way around the frame.
7. Once you reach the corner, secure and staple down one side of the edge, then, pinch at the corner of the fabric Pull the fabric so that it is snug as it comes around the corner. Arrange the folds in a manner that is pleasing to the eye, pinch, and pull tight before stapling.
